



- Transportation equipment exports in the Southeast region accounted for 24.5 percent of the U.S. total transportation equipment exports in 2024.

- The automotive industry in the Southeast is booming, driven by automotive assemblers choosing the South for their electric vehicle plants. Georgia has especially benefited from the EV industry's investment.
- Automotive companies locating in the Southeast thrive with many expanding within a year of opening a new facility.




Port of Brunswick

The Port of Brunswick, Georgia, was the top U.S. port for vehicles in 2024. Brunswick achieved a record year, totaling 901,912 units of autos and heavy equipment, up 13.3% and 160% y/y, respectively. Brunswick was also the top port for ro-ro exports at 600,000 tons, the port said, citing USATradeonline data.

Exports on the Rise: Georgia's transportation equipment exports grew 7.5 percent annually since 2000, reaching \$14.2 billion in 2024, accounting for 20 percent of the Southeast's total. Georgia is also growing at a much faster rate than the U.S.

Low Unionization Keeps Georgia's Workforce Competitive.


Like other states in the Southeast, Georgia has very low unionization, particularly in manufacturing. Currently, 3.8 percent of Georgia's total workforce is unionized. Just 0.7 percent of private manufacturing workers are unionized, well below the national average.

Georgia's Electric Vehicle Ecosystem

Electric vehicles (EVs) are the future of the automotive industry. As automotive manufacturers commit to adding electric vehicles to their fleets, Georgia is positioning itself as a hub for electric vehicle, battery, and other support operations for the electric transportation industry.

Since 2018, Georgia has attracted 44 EV-related operations and expansions for a total 32,000 jobs and \$24.6 billion in capital investment. SK innovation led the way with a \$2.6 billion electric battery manufacturing facility.



And most recently, Hyundai Motor Group's suppliers are arriving in Georgia. In 2023 and 2024, 20 Tier 1 & 2 Hyundai suppliers located in Georgia, projected to create more than 7,000 jobs and \$4.5 billion in capital investment.

MAGNET (Mississippi-Alabama-Georgia Network for Evolving Transportation)

In August 2025, area governors, power company executives and university presidents established MAGNET, a regional economic development initiative aimed at leveraging the Southeastern U.S. automotive vehicle and battery industry to stimulate economic development and job growth. Joining The University of Alabama are the University of Georgia and Mississippi State University, each with critical expertise in all aspects of the automotive industry and emerging technologies.

MAGNET organizes the region's extensive and relevant capabilities and resources into a single, coordinated effort to ensure that the transportation revolution benefits from a well-supported infrastructure, a skilled workforce and a robust innovation pipeline.



Georgia's Commitment to EV Expansion

In early 2021, Southern Company joined 5 other energy companies to create the Electric Highway Coalition to collaborate on a network of DC fast chargers from the Atlantic Coast through the Midwest and South and into the Gulf and Central Plains regions. The coalition will provide drivers with effective, efficient, and convenient charging options to enable long-distance electric travel.

Electric Mobility and Innovation Alliance

In 2021, Georgia Governor Brian Kemp formed the Georgia Electric Mobility and Innovation Alliance (EMIA). Led by the Georgia Department of Economic Development, EMIA is a statewide alliance that consists of partners ranging from government, industries, electric utilities, non-profits, and other stakeholders. They all share the common goal of growing the electric mobility ecosystem in the state and strengthening Georgia's position in electric vehicle-related manufacturing and innovation.

University of Georgia's Electric Mobility Initiative

With the goal of enhancing research, education, and outreach opportunities, UGA established a campus-wide Electric Mobility Initiative that will provide seed funding for new projects, including the development of educational programs such as the E-Mobility Certificate, and bring together thought leaders to discuss innovative approaches to electric mobility across Georgia and the region.

Augusta Tech's Automotive Service Training Center

With funding support from the Georgia Power Foundation, Jim Hudson Automotive Group, Augusta National Golf Club, and the Knox Foundation, Augusta Tech will expand their center to 650,000 square feet and will provide workforce training for 1,000 technicians.


