GEORGIA POWER LOCATIONS & GROWTH IN 2025

As of December 31, 2025, Georgia Power's Economic Development Team had assisted **90** companies in locating or expanding in Georgia, resulting in the creation and retention of more than **18,000+ jobs** and **\$8.7 billion** in capital investment.

Manufacturing accounted for 62% of last year's job creation with transportation equipment making up nearly 4,000 of the total jobs.

Despite uncertainty with tariff policy, foreign direct investment (FDI) remained strong in Georgia, comprising over 30% of project activity. Companies investing in Georgia hailed from 15 different countries, demonstrating Georgia's reach on a global scale.

Looking ahead for 2026, the economic development pipeline remains robust. In partnership with the state and local communities, our team is excited for another successful year supporting a growing Georgia.

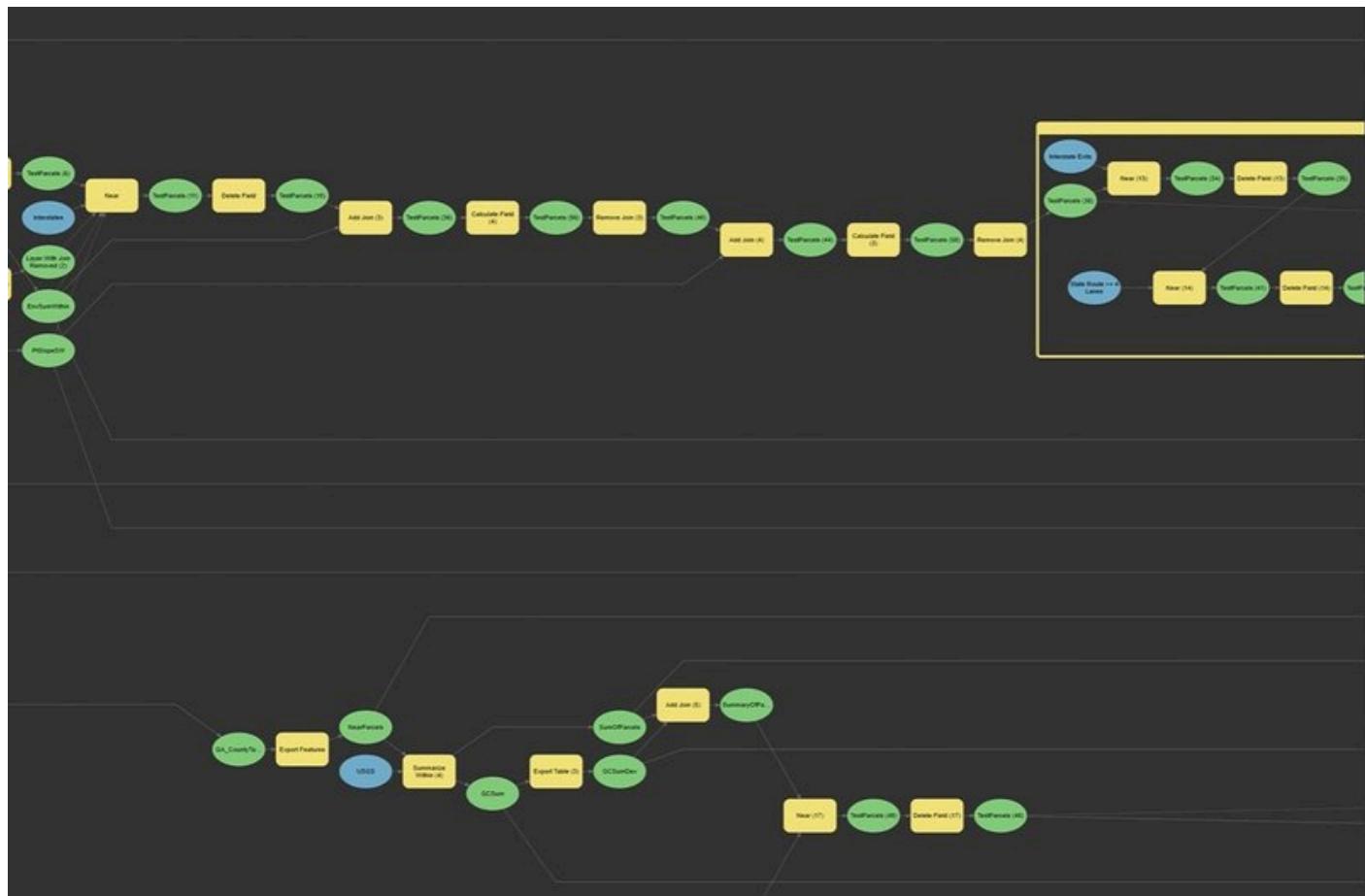

SAM™: A Smarter Approach to Site Identification

Georgia Power has an eye on the future of industrial sites in Georgia. Our Site Assessment Matrix (SAM™) — a proprietary and now trademarked evaluation model — proactively identifies and ranks potential industrial sites before they're even on the market.

SAM™ leverages a combination of GIS analysis, infrastructure modeling, and local field verification to score each site across key dimensions like access to power, gas, water, and sewer systems, proximity to transportation infrastructure, workforce accessibility, environmental factors, and community engagement. Each site is then ranked based on these weighted criteria, creating a clear, data-backed snapshot of industrial development viability.

The hybrid model of data science and local expertise allows our team to pinpoint high-potential properties long before they appear on a client's shortlist.

"When we present a site to a company, that due diligence has already been done," said Jennifer Zeller, Strategic Solutions Director, "That means fewer surprises, and more confidence in the final location."
